#### SERVICE IN AREA OF SPECIALITY

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

HURL - effectively supervised and guided a staff of 20 with no angry resignations, personnel actions, grievances, or major disputes. Brought in over \$35 million in extramural funding during 15 years running the program. Wiltshire undertook a large number of innovative dive operations and supervised the rehabilitation of the LRT, an innovative low cost launch system for the submersibles in 2011. A few of the many major program highlights include finding the sunken Japanese mini sub that lead the Dec 1941 Pearl Harbor attack, characterizing Loihi Seamount (the next Hawaiian Island), exploring the immense submarine volcanoes of the Kermadec Arc, developing a procedure to work with scuba divers sampling meso-photic corals and finding dozens of new deep water species in the North West Hawaiian Islands. After funding was lost in 2015, Wiltshire wrote all final close-out reports. The last major administrative phase of work was handling requests for data, video and past dive information as well as assisting for staff members in new placements. All former staff have found successful new positions.

**ORE ABET** - Wiltshire was the accreditation coordinator for ORE. He wrote the 250-page document for the two most recent ORE accreditations in 2010 and 2016. In September 2016, ORE received the highest accreditation possible, a full six years. ORE was reviewed as having no concerns, weaknesses or

deficiencies (a perfect score). ORE ranked the best of the five engineering departments being accredited at UH. What Wiltshire did differently than in previous accreditations was to design a different method of highlighting ORE work and address some of the previously cited concerns in a proactive manner. This effort was presented at the UH peer reviewed accreditation symposium in April, 2016

#### Outreach to the Ocean Engineering Profession

Oceans 2011 MTS/IEEE Kona — Wiltshire was general chair of the combined annual meeting of the Marine Technology Society and Oceanic Engineering Society in September 2011. This meeting was a risky experiment for the sponsoring societies involved. At the time the decision was finalized to hold the meeting, the U.S. had just gone into major recession and the meeting was scheduled, not only in a remote locale (Hawaii) but on an outer island (Kona). This presented challenges and was strongly opposed by some of the exhibitors. Exhibit spaces pay for a third of the cost of the meeting. In spite of the downturned economy and the higher costs on the Big Island for everything from transportation to staffing, the meeting was a resounding success bringing in \$5 million to the depressed local economy. It attracted a record number of papers and 1,500 attendees, which is a record for MTS/IEEE meetings in Hawaii. Wiltshire pulled together a diverse team of volunteers and kept them motivated and focused. In spite of the economic times, Oceans '11 Kona was able to turn a profit, much to the surprise and grateful delight of the societies involved. Wiltshire continues to work with MTS.

Marine Geotechnology and Georesources Journal - Since taking over as editor of this journal in 2008, Wiltshire has tripled the journal's impact rating. It has steadily increased each year in ranking against peer journals. The journal, once in danger of being cancelled, is now among the highest rated journals in the geotechnical and marine minerals fields. In 2018, 370 review worthy manuscripts were submitted. Thirty-five percent of these were published. Wiltshire reorganized the Editorial Board, revamped the review process, had them join ScholarOne (the online submission and review system), and convinced the community to publish in this journal. The impact factor jump has been greatly praised by the publisher, Taylor and Francis.

*PACON* - The *Pacific Congress on Marine Science and Technology* is a small, specialized conference held every two years and is designed for east-west scientific exchange. Wiltshire is one of the founding members of the conference, currently serving on the Board of Directors as Treasurer, and was a key organizer for PACON 2010 (Hilo) and PACON 2012 held in Kona. PACON '14 was held in Tokyo, Japan. PACON'17 was held in Zhou Shan China. Wiltshire is part of the committee bringing PACON to Vladivostok, Russia in July 2019.

*On-going Research* - Work in the area of marine minerals dealing with tailings is being published in a major new book which came out in May, 2017. The tailings work is on-going and has been submitted to Nautilus Minerals for consideration of support. I am part of an NSF grant which was submitted with a blue ribbon team from Carnegie Mellon University in 2016 for work on HVDC deep sea cables as a way to transmit renewable energies long distances. The grant is under revision for a resubmission in 2019 after favorable reviews. I am also working with BOEM on the potential application of deep sea compressed air storage as a way to store excess power generated by renewable sources and keep it available for later use.

#### **AWARDS**

In 2011, Wiltshire received the prestigious **President's Citation Award** from The Society for Mining, Metallurgy, and Exploration (SME) for work in developing the marine mining industry. Wiltshire continues his work with SME to foster marine mining and will be discussing key updates at their Feb 2019 annual meeting.
